of other people.

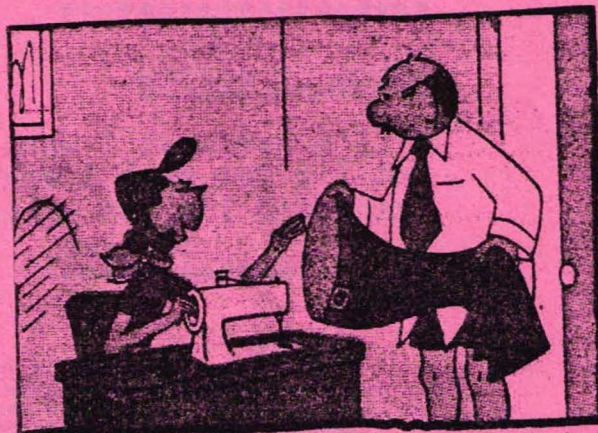
Then I moved on and got involved

CONCEPT ONE

Now that I've completed my current thoughts on the 12 traditions, I'd like to talk about the 12 concepts for World Service. AA adopted these at their 12th annual General Service Conference on April 26, 1962. And OA recommends their use (see pages 12, 19, 22 of your OA Group Handbook).

Concept One - The final responsibility and the ultimate authority for OA World Service should always reside in the collective conscience of our whole fellowship.

This concept is closely related to Tradition 2. OA groups have the final authority of a loving God as He expresses Himself in the group conscience and leaders are to be entrusted with delegated responsibilities, only.

For this principle to work, we need enough enlightenment, enough responsibility and enough love of God and man to insure our democracy of World Service will work under all conditions. I believe democracy doesn't work when people are uninformed and/or apathetic and/or power-seeking. But people who are recovering through the 12 steps in groups which practice the 12 traditions become a spiritualized society. These people then become enlightened and responsible. We love our fellow members and we love the principles upon which our lives today are founded. As a whole fellowship, then, our collective conscience is worthy of the authority and the responsibility the first Concept gives.
